wherever they are.

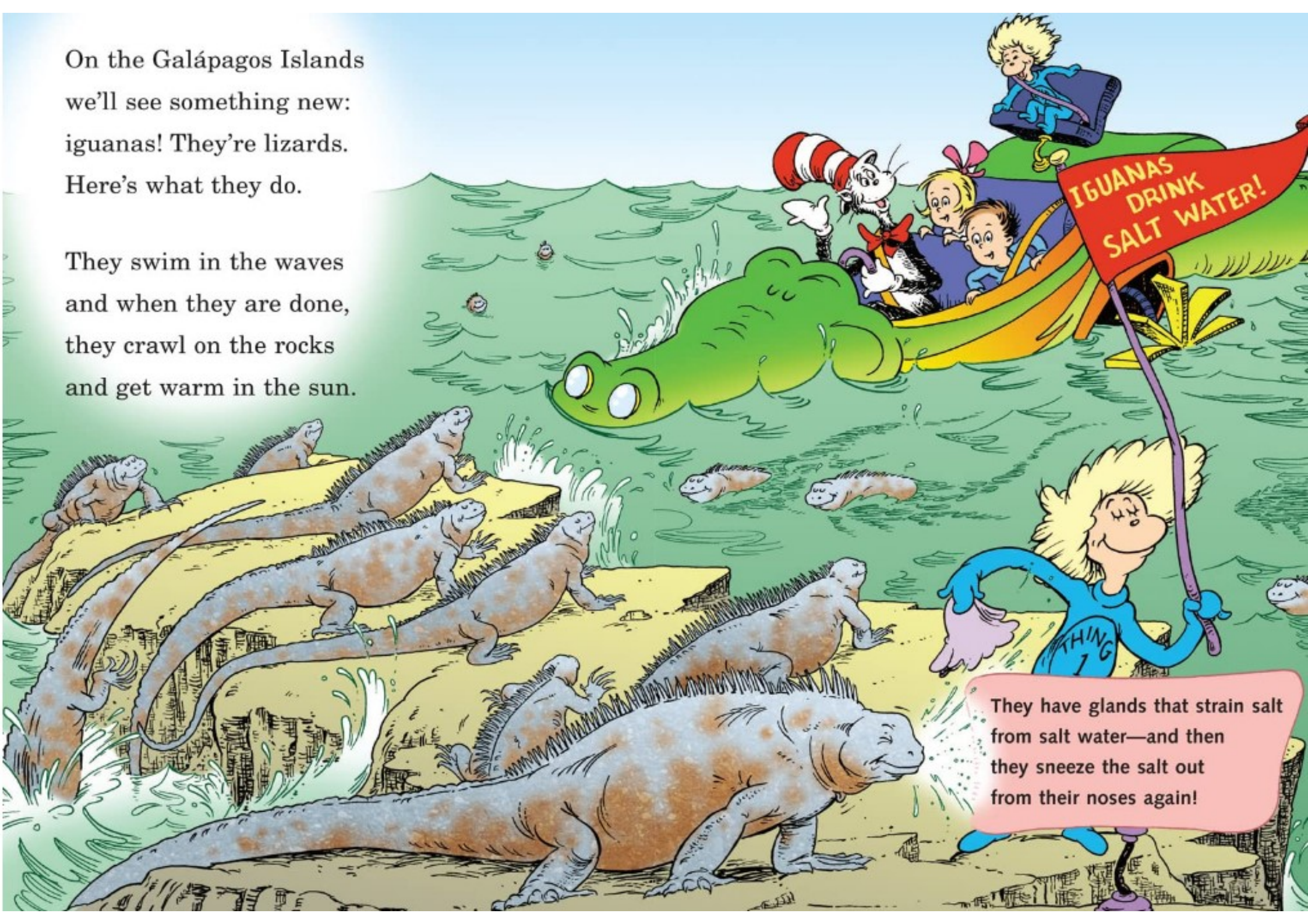
We'll find lizards and turtles,

and get warm in the sun.




IGUANAS
