## Robert Kouis Stevenson

Robert Louis Stevenson was born in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1850. From a very early age he suffered from health problems. At the age of seventeen, he started to study engineering at Edinburgh University, but then switched to studying law. When he graduated in 1875, he did not become a lawyer since he now knew he wanted to be a writer. In his life he wrote many short stories, novels, poems and essays.

When travelling in France in 1876, he met the American Fanny Osbourne, and they married four
years later. In the years following his marriage, Stevenson wrote many of his most famous books. Treasure Island was first published in 1881-82, and both Kidnapped and The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde came out in I886.

In I889, Stevenson and his family went to live in Samoa in the South Pacific. The weather there was good for his health, but he died suddenly in December 1894. He is remembered as one of the most famous adventure story writers of all time.

## Treasure Island



Treasure Island was Robert Louis Stevenson's first novel. The idea for it came to him when he was on holiday with his family in the Scottish Highlands in the summer of 1881. Rainy weather forced them to amuse themselves indoors, and Stevenson and his twelve-year-old stepson, Lloyd, drew a map of an imaginary place, "Treasure Island". Excited by this map, Stevenson began to write a story based on it to entertain his family. At this time, two types of sea novel were popular: the pirate adventure at sea and the desert island story. Treasure 1sland is a brilliant combination of the two.

When it was first published in the magazine Young Folks from October 1881 to January 1882, Treasure 1sland attracted little attention and failed to boost the magazine's sales. But when published as a book in 1883, it soon became very popular and was widely praised by critics.
